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# M e t h o d o l o g y   & L o g i s t i c s

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## **Study Sample**

- A total of 525 voting age residents of Ontario, 18 years of age and older were interviewed between the days of February 20<sup>th</sup> and February 25<sup>th</sup> 2004. Earthroots commissioned the survey.

## **Survey Method**

- The survey was conducted using computer-assisted techniques of telephone interviewing (CATI) and random number selection. A total of 20% of all interviews were monitored and the management of Oraclepoll Research supervised 100%.

## **Logistics**

- The survey was conducted between the days of February 20<sup>th</sup> and February 25<sup>th</sup> 2004. Initial calls were made between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Subsequent callbacks of no-answers and busy numbers were made on a (staggered) daily rotating basis up to 7 times (from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.) until contact was made. In addition, telephone interview appointments were attempted with those respondents unable to complete the survey at the time of contact. If no contact was made at a number after the seventh attempt, the number was discarded.

## **Confidence**

- The margin of error for results from the entire 500-person survey is  $\pm 4.3\%$ , 19/20 times.

# Executive Summary

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## Summary

Voters largely view the practice of wolf hunting in an unfavourable light, including 70% of those that live at a household with someone who has a hunting licence.

There is also limited support for having an open season on wolf hunting.

Where slightly more than six in ten support hunting wolves in order to defend property and animals, there is strong opposition to sport hunting (88%) and killing wolves in order to sell their pelts (82%).

In addition to wanting a ban on sport hunting, more than seven want an end to the practice of baiting and using dogs to hunt wolves.

A strong majority of voters also want bag limits, kills to be reported and closing the spring season when pups are born.

74% want more land set aside for wolves and support protecting more wolf habitat. In addition, 89% are of the opinion that wolves should receive at least the same or more protection as other species in Ontario.

88% favour having a sustainable wolf management program, as most do not see that enough is currently being done now to manage wolves.

There is considerable support for extending the moratorium on the hunting and snaring of the Eastern Canadian Wolf in Algonquin Park among almost nine in ten Ontarians.

In addition, 90% of voters in the province either support (19%) or strongly support (71%) the permanent protection of species at risk such as the Eastern Canadian Wolf.

Three-quarters oppose having industrial activities in parks and a very high 88% oppose hunting in provincial parks in Ontario.

Instead, the protection of wildlife and wildlife habitat is seen as being the primary purpose for Ontario's parks, followed by providing recreational opportunities such as hiking and camping.

Almost two-thirds of Ontario residents also stated that they would like to see a wolf in the wild, representing an eco-tourism opportunity for the "wolf howl" and an opportunity to increase the public's affinity for the wolf.

In summary, Ontario voters clearly want to see wolves managed more effectively and measures put in place to protect the species at least on par with other wildlife in the province.

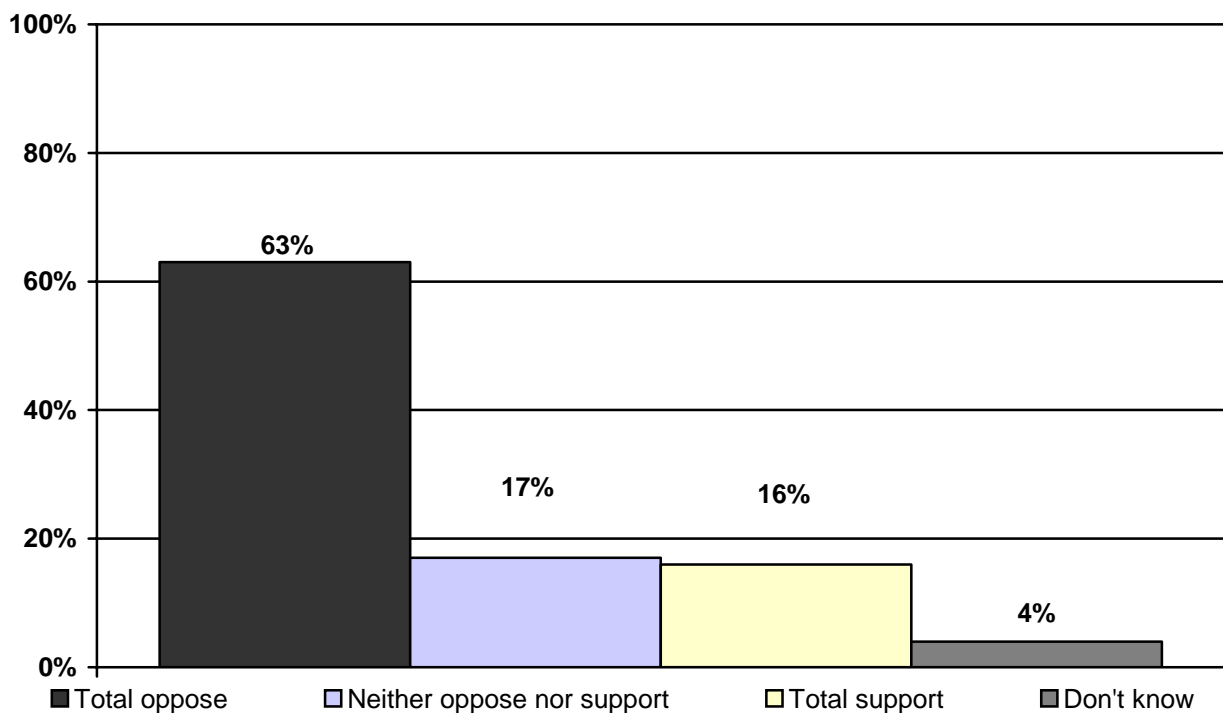
Opposition to the practice of wolf hunting is not surprising, considering the dim view most Ontarians have towards sport hunting and the practice of baiting in parks and protected areas.

## Perceptions of Hunting

*In Ontario, there is a year round open hunting season on wolves, with the exception of limited park areas in the province. There are also no limits on the number of wolves that can be killed by hunters for sport or by trappers who sell their pelts. Wolf kills do not have to be reported.*

*In addition to sport or trophy hunting and trapping, wolves are killed because they are viewed by some people as being a nuisance and by farmers to protect their livestock.*

More than six in ten Ontario residents oppose having an open season on wolves while only 16% support having one, while 21% either have a neutral opinion or do not know.

Respondents were then asked if they had a favourable or unfavourable opinion of hunting wolves under each of the following scenarios.

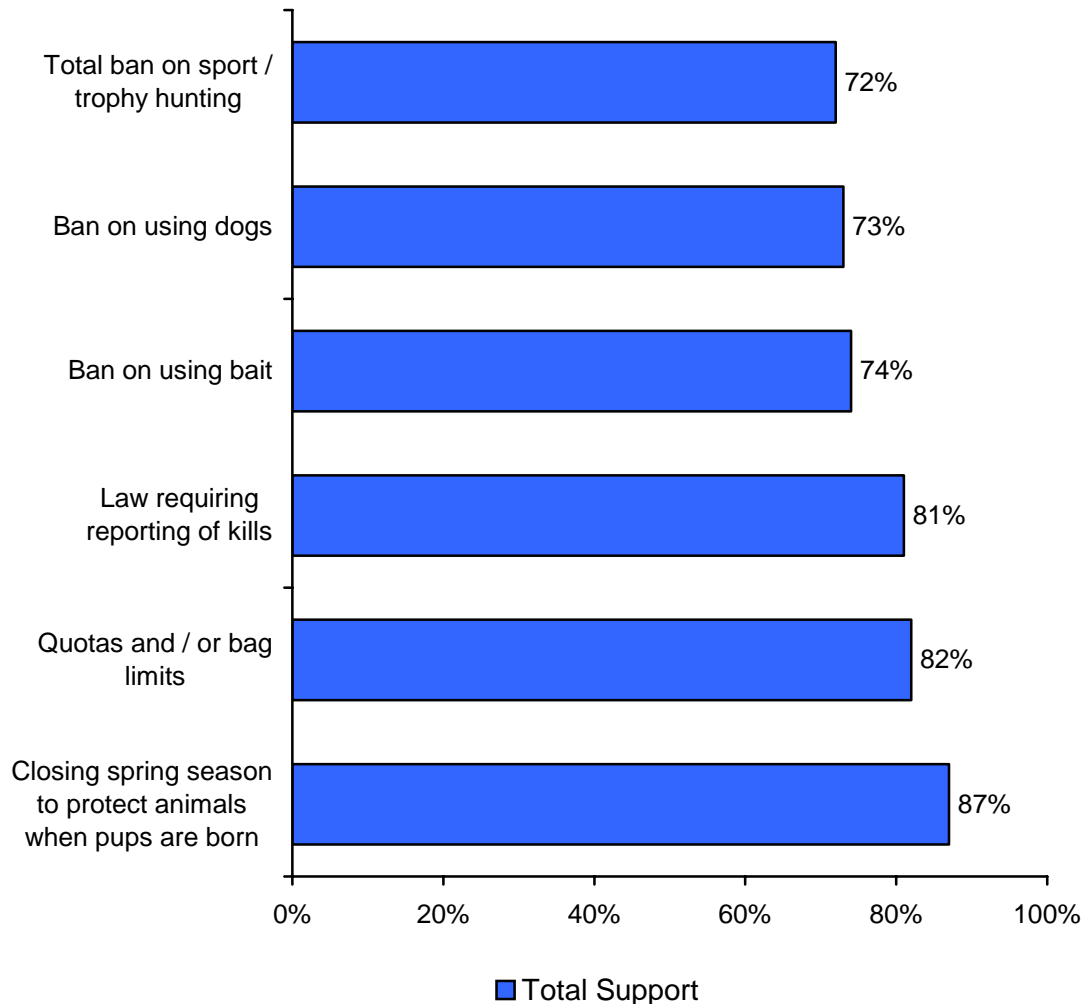

While there is limited support for the concept of hunting wolves in general, a 61% majority do consider wolf hunting to be favourable when the situation involves defending property and farm animals.

A high number of Ontarians consider hunting to obtain pelts for resale and especially sport hunting to be unfavourable practices.

## Support / Opposition

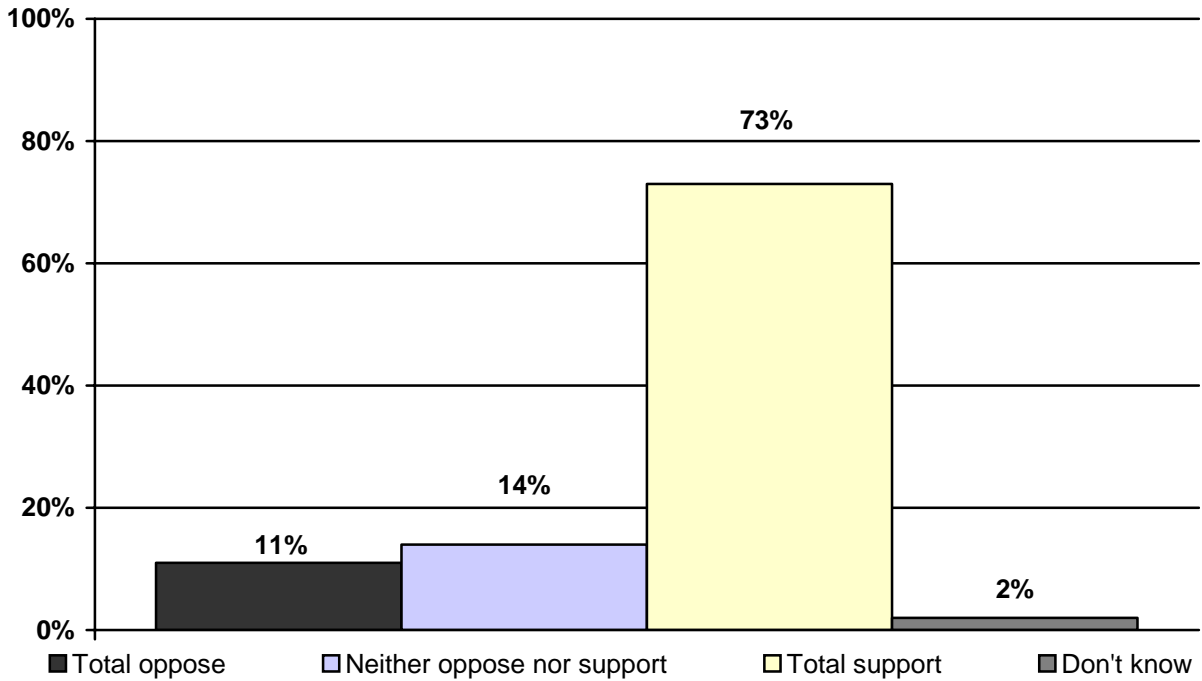
Some hunters use dogs to track and chase wolves, while some others also use bait to attract the wolves to a set location where they are then shot.



More than seven in ten respondents support a total ban on the sport hunting of wolves, as well as supporting the banning of dogs and bait during hunts.

Support for legislation requiring the reporting of kills increases to 81% and to 82% for the setting of quotas and or bag limits on the number of wolves a hunter can kill. However, the strongest support was in relation to closing the hunting season in the spring to protect wolves when their pups are born.

*”As stated earlier, wolves are protected from hunters only in limited park areas in Ontario that amounts to approximately 3% of their total range. Would you support or oppose setting aside more land for wolf protection.”*

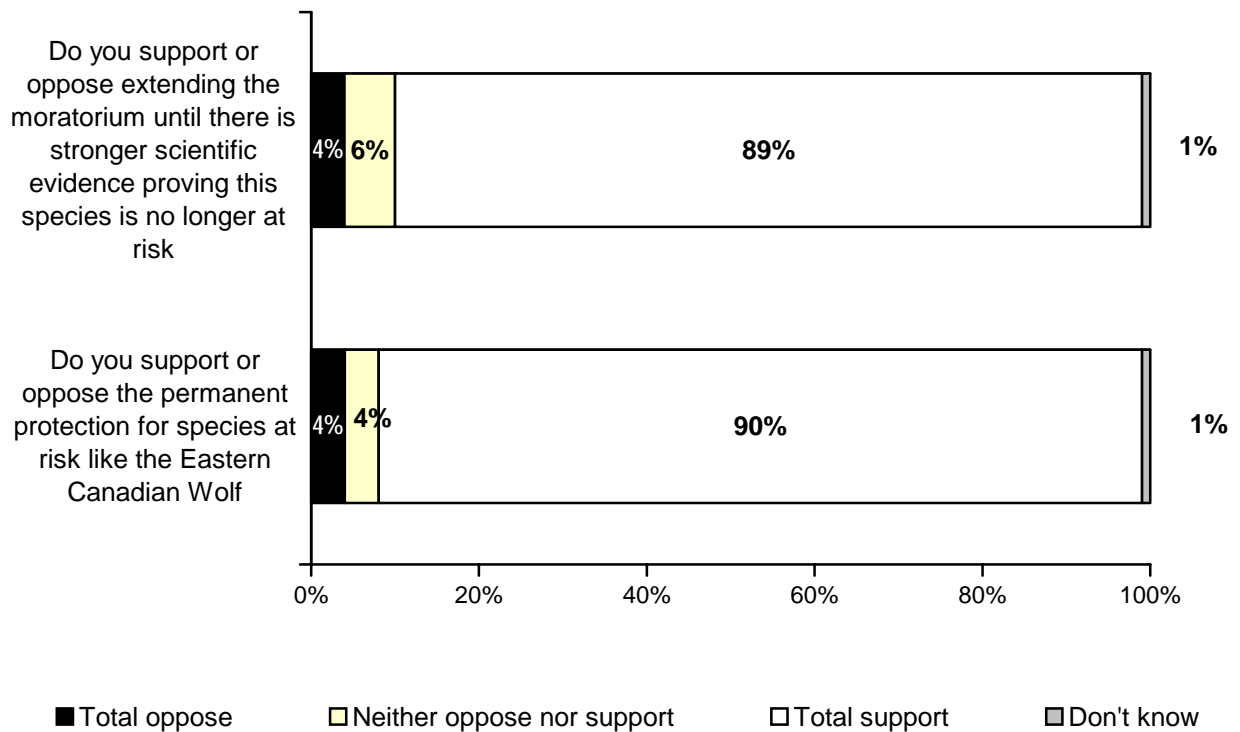


Almost three –quarters of voting age Ontario residents interviewed support the setting aside of more land in the province for wolf protection, while only 11% would oppose this move.

Furthermore, 56% are of the opinion that wolves should receive at least the same amount of wildlife protection as other species such as the racoon, one-third (33%) feel it should have more protection, while only 8% said wolves should have less protection and 3% did not know.

## Eastern Canadian Wolf

*“Algonquin Provincial Park is the largest protected habitat for the Eastern Canadian Wolf, which is classified as a national species at risk. A 30-month moratorium or suspension on the hunting and snaring of the Eastern Canadian Wolf that was put in place by the government of Ontario in the townships surrounding Algonquin Park expires in June of this year. While this moratorium was intended to help the species re-populate, some scientists claim that 30 months is not enough time to support the recovery of the declining population.”*



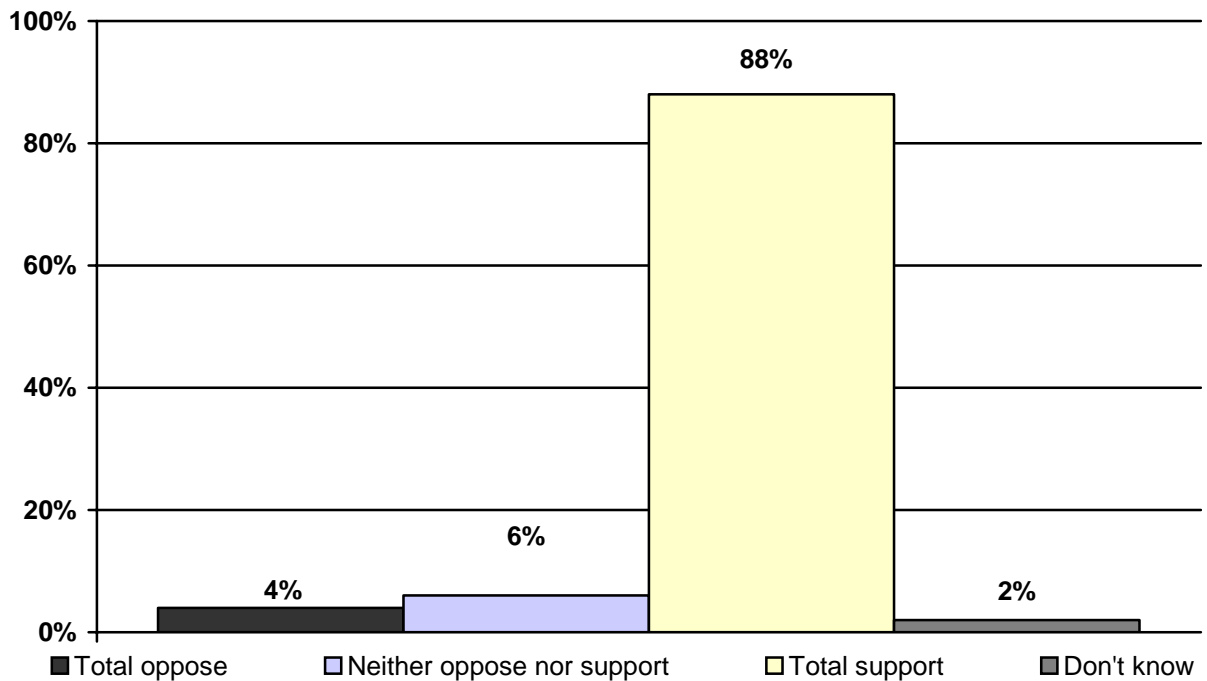
There is considerable support for extending the moratorium on the hunting and snaring of the Eastern Canadian Wolf in Algonquin Park. Almost nine in ten Ontarians either support (16%) or strongly support (73%) the extension, with 91% of Liberal voters and 81% of northern Ontario residents also being in favor of the moratorium.

In addition, 90% of voters in the province either support (19%) or strongly support (71%) the permanent protection of species at risk such as the Eastern Canadian Wolf. 93% of Liberal voters would support this move as would 85% of northern Ontarians and 81% of voters where there is a hunting license at their residence.

A total of 66% of respondents also expressed an interest in seeing a wolf in an eco-tourism experience such as Algonquin Park wolf howl. GTA (74%) and Toronto (70%) residents were most interested in this experience as were 18-34 year olds (72%).

## Management Practices

*“And do you support or oppose having sustainable wolf management programs in all provincial parks in Ontario?”*

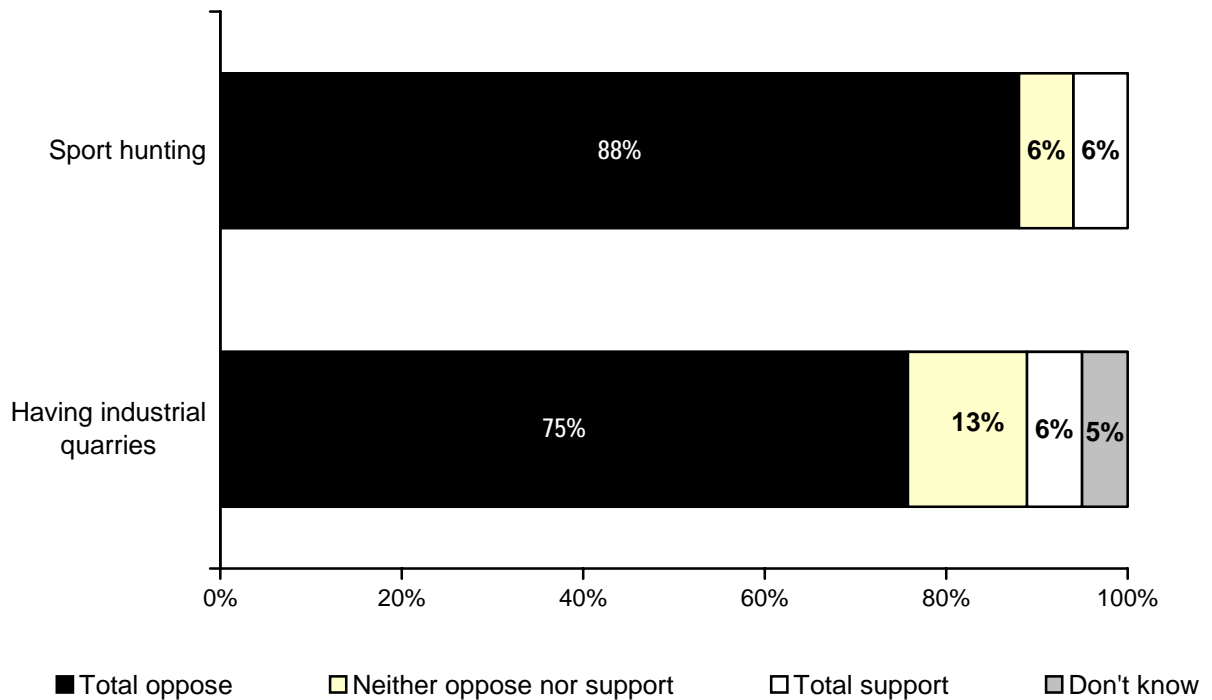


A strong majority of 88% support having sustainable wolf management programs in all of Ontario's provincial parks. However, only 12% feel that the province is currently doing enough to manage wolves and 42% are of the opinion that too little is being done. While only 3% stated that too much is being done to protect wolves, a high 43% were unaware of what is being done to manage wolves in the province.

**Respondents were then asked a series of questions on uses of Ontario’s provincial parks.**

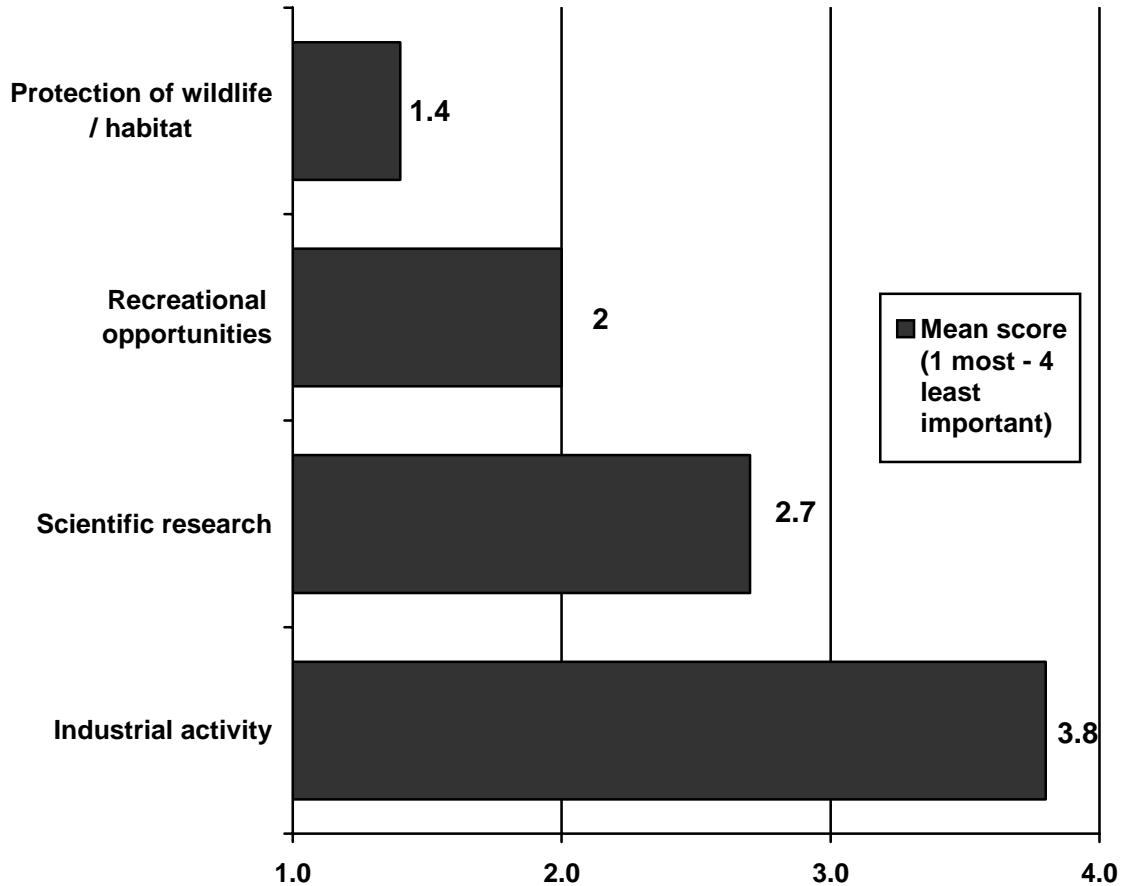
*“Today Ontario has more than 600 provincial parks and protected areas covering 9 million hectares (over 23 million acres), representing just under 9% of the province’s land area.*

There is significant opposition to having quarries in parks and especially having sport hunting in these protected areas.

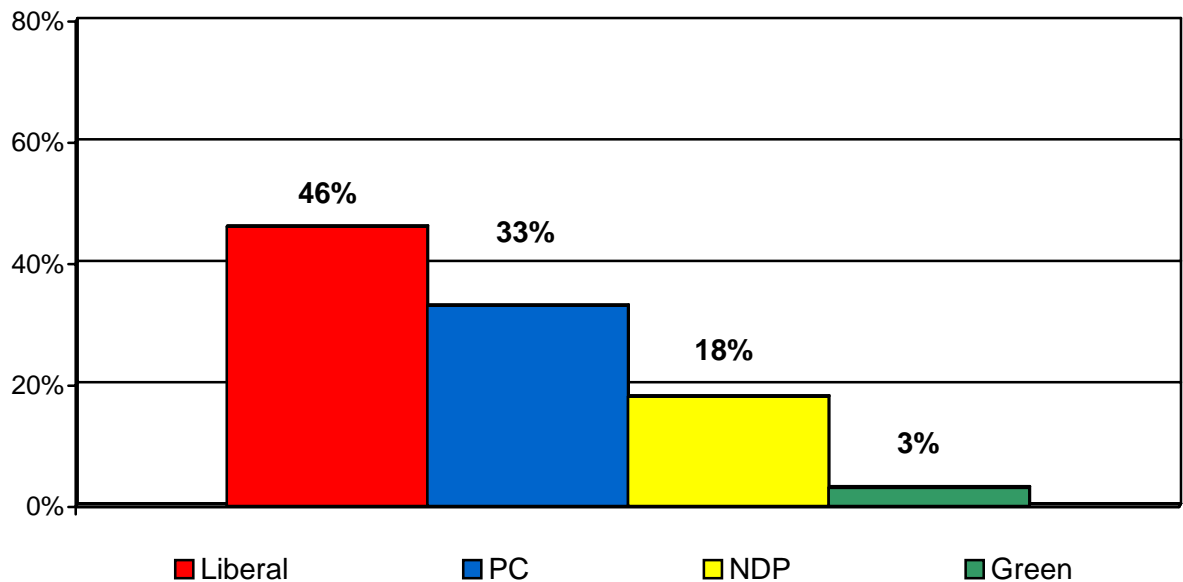


The protection of wildlife and wildlife habitat is seen as being the primary purpose for Ontario’s parks, followed by providing recreational opportunities such as hiking and camping. Industrial activities were least favoured.

# Vote Intent

*If the provincial election were held today in Ontario, which party candidate would you vote most likely vote for?*

*[IF UNDECIDED ASKED] If the provincial election were held today in Ontario, which party's candidate would you most likely be leaning towards?*



If a provincial election were held in Ontario, the Liberals would have the backing of 46% of decided voters in the province, the Tories would be supported by 33% and the NDP by 18% of the electorate. The Green Party is now supported by 3% of decided voters in Ontario. A total of 20% of voters surveyed were undecided.

Despite the 13% lead over the PC's, the news was not all good for the governing Liberals, as only 19% of those surveyed had a favorable opinion of Dalton's McGuinty's Liberals, while 36% had an unfavorable one and 35% held a neutral view. 9% had no opinion.

Furthermore, a low 15% rated the government's performance to date as good or very good, while almost four in ten (39%) felt that its performance was either poor or very poor. A significant 39% also had provided a neutral score and 7% had no opinion.
